Through this agreement, the above parties enter into an agreement regarding the rental or letting of a caravan. This also includes the accompanying inventory, which must be listed in an inventory list that must be checked by both parties and which is located on the inside of the toilet door.

The renter must check everything themselves upon arrival.

In between the delivery and collection of the caravan, our transporter will check the caravan inside and out by means of an inspection with photos.

You are therefore responsible for any unreported damage and damage caused by third parties.

This concerns a caravan: Brand: Hobby or Bürstner

Damage to the interior, exterior, contents, air conditioning unit, tables, chairs, awning, and bike rack is at the risk of the tenant, except for normal wear and tear.

Rules for in and around the caravan:

We have a number of simple rules for the use of the caravan, so that everyone can get the most out of it. However, the following rules apply.

1. The toilet in the caravan may not be used! Due to tenants not cleaning it properly, we are forced to enforce this rule.
2. The caravan and its contents must be returned clean, undamaged, and tidy.
3. The awning/front tent must be cleaned and neatly folded before being returned.
4. Gas bottles must be returned and, for safety reasons, may not be left in the caravan.
5. The caravan will be delivered to you and must be assembled by you.
6. The caravan may not be moved for transport purposes.
7. Bed linen and towels must be brought by you.

If these rules are not followed, the following costs will be charged to the deposit.

An amount of €100.00 for cleaning the interior An amount of €125 for cleaning the contents An amount of €75 for cleaning the awning An amount of €100 for cleaning the front tent.

Any other damage will be recovered from you by means of an appraisal.

Welcome to our caravan. We wish you a fantastic vacation. Here are some rules and tips for your vacation to ensure that everything runs smoothly.

Rules:

- The toilet in the caravan may not be used. This is to prevent hygiene problems for the next
- renter.
- Installing the split air conditioning

- Step-by-step plan
- Place all necessary items on the table in the caravan to keep everything organized.
- Attach the window brackets to the air conditioner with the black screws.
- Hang the air conditioner out of the window.
- There are now two screws on the inside of the caravan. Tighten these by hand so that the air conditioner is securely in place.
- On the outside, you will find two adjustment screws. Use these to level the air conditioner.

The caravan and its contents must be returned clean, undamaged, and tidy. If you break any small items, you will have to replace them at your own expense. If you break something else that is expensive, you must call the rental company and make arrangements about what to do next.

The awning/front tent must be cleaned and neatly folded before being returned.

How does the awning work?

- Unzip the bag and undo the Velcro, then roll out the awning completely.
- When storing the awning of the caravan, first remove the legs that are attached to the caravan. You will find the legs at the bottom. Click the pin in to release the legs from the lock.
- About halfway along the length of the legs, you will find a black clip. Push this up to adjust the height of the legs.
- The vertical legs also have legs attached to them that need to be attached to the caravan. These can be easily clicked off and attached to the caravan.
- Reattach these to the vertical legs.
- Then push the black clip back up to slide the vertical legs together and reattach them to the bottom. Push the pin in, otherwise the legs will not lock into place.
- Roll up the awning neatly and fasten the Velcro again, zip the bag closed, and you're done.

However, it goes without saying that you should clean and dry the awning before rolling it up.

If you have booked a spot in advance and notified us, your caravan will be ready at the spot and all you have to do is extend the legs and lower the awning. The leg key

can be found in the drawbar box on the outside front of the caravan. Caravan keys: are located in the drawbar box in a key safe with the code 112. When you leave, please put them back in the box and reset the code to zero.

Connecting power to the caravan:

The extension cords are in the drawbar box. Connect one end to the caravan and the other to the campsite's power box, and you're done.

Check inside to see if the refrigerator is on! The buttons are located on the top.

Gas cylinder: due to the new law since January 1, 2024, gas cylinders are prohibited in the caravan at the caravan transport and storage facilities. You can buy one at the campsite shop and return it before departure.

Leave the caravan clean after your rental period. Our caravans are all clean before your rental period begins, so please clean the caravan after your rental period so that the next renters arrive in a tidy caravan and their vacation gets off to a good start.

Disposable pillowcases

We have disposable pillowcases for all our pillows, which you can find in the caravan. These should be placed under your own pillowcases. Only remove them if they are dirty, as this prevents unnecessary additional consumption.

Tip! Rent an extra refrigerator at the reception (if possible). Inform the reception desk of your location and the lane where you are staying. Please note that this costs money and is, of course, at your own expense.

What is there to do in the province of Castellón?

Popular attractions

- Peñíscola and Papa Luna Castle: This is one of the most beautiful villages in Spain. The medieval castle is located on a rock jutting out into the sea and once served as the residence of Pope Benedict XIII.
- Morella: A spectacular walled city built on top of a hill. The enormous castle and the Gothic basilica of Santa María la Mayor are absolute highlights.
- Coves de Sant Josep (La Vall d'Uixó): Here you can take a boat trip on the longest navigable underground river in Europe. It is a unique experience in a beautiful cave system.
- Vilafamés: This village is known for its pinkish stone houses and the “Roca Grossa,” a gigantic rock that seems to balance in the middle of the village. There is also a museum of modern art (MACVAC).
- Montanejos (Fuente de los Baños): A natural spring with thermal water that is around 25 degrees all year round. It is a wonderful place to swim, surrounded by steep gorges.
- Culla: A beautifully preserved medieval village in the mountains. It feels as if time has stood still here.

Permanent Covered Markets (Mercados Centrales)

Ideal for local specialties, fresh fish, vegetables, and fruit.

Castellón de la Plana (Mercado Central): Located on the Plaza Mayor. Open Monday through Saturday (7:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.).

Vinaròs (Mercat de Vinaròs): Known for its famous local langoustines (gambas). Open Monday to Friday (8:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. – 8:30 p.m.) and Saturday (7:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.).
